Pine River Institute is an innovative co-ed residential treatment program for teens struggling with addictive behaviours. We are a family-centered program comprised of 4 phases: Wilderness (Outdoor Leadership Experience), Residential, Transition, and Aftercare. Every student, upon entering the program, spends 8 or more weeks in Huntsville before moving to the residence. Day-to-day activities in wilderness include canoeing, hiking, snowshoeing, group initiatives, group and individual therapy, and journaling. Youths live and work in nature in groups of up to eight, with three staff.

Our campus is situated on 200 acres of spectacular Niagara Escarpment land near Shelburne, Ontario. The program here includes outdoor education, individual, group, and family therapy, expressive arts, athletics, and life skills, as well as the more traditional academic offerings.

We are currently seeking experienced Wilderness Field Instructors that have an interest in program coordination as well as field work to help us deliver this unique program, primarily in Huntsville or Algonquin Park, however there may be some opportunities at the Shelburne campus.

Qualifications

We are looking for individuals with the qualifications and related experience in Wilderness field work. This individual will demonstrate patience, integrity, commitment, and an ability to maintain clear boundaries, and a sense of humour.

- Experience working with at-risk youth and young adults in a wilderness setting
- Clear certification of Vulnerable Sector Criminal Check
- Willingness to secure Canadian work permit, if required
- Ability to drive snowmobile, argo

Primary responsibilities in the field

- ensuring therapeutic goals of the program in general and the individual therapeutic plan for the students are realized
- planning, preparing and understanding logistics and equipment needs while in the woods
- teaching basic wilderness/survival skills
- leading and coordinating daily travel and outdoor activities/initiatives, canoeing, hiking etc.
- ensuring student safety and well-being
- organizing, leading and participating in student's daily activities
- participation in and facilitation of group meetings and discussions

- Food, equipment and vehicle prep for trips
- Ongoing maintenance around base camp including, laundry, cleaning, light repairs
- Ongoing support to the woods team
- On call field instructor
